Two thirds of the Palestinians are refugees not allowed to return home, because they are not Jews. Meanwhile, Russian and Ethiopian immigrants are pouring in daily...

Denial of the Right of Return is perpetuation of Ethnic Cleansing which is a War Crime.

Where is their land ?

Pre-1948 Jewish-controlled Land	Sq. km
Remaining Palestinians Land	1,403 (more than half confiscated)
Expelled Palestians Land	17,178

That is, 92% of the land that became Israel is Palestinian ...

Should and Can the Palestinian Refugees Return Home ?

Yes. Because the Right of Return is ...

Sacred,

It is in the psyche of every Palestinian. No peace can prevail without it.

Legal,

It is a basic right, derived from the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and all international and regional covenants. It is an individual right derived from the sanctity of private ownership and a collective right derived from the Principle of Self-determination. It has no statute of limitation and cannot be extinguished by a treaty or the establishment of a state. It is affirmed by the UN resolution 194 and repeatedly confirmed by the international community over 110 times in 50 years, unparalleled in UN history.

Possible.

78% of Jews live in 14% of Israel. The remaining 22% of Jews live in 86% of Israel's area, which is Palestinian land. Most of them live in a dozen or two Palestinian towns. A tiny minority lives in kibbutz, now ideologically and economically bankrupt. This minority exploits the vast Palestinian land.

Thus, only 20,000 Jews exploit 17,325 sq. km, which is the home and heritage of 5,248,186 refugees, crammed in camps and denied the right to return home ...

Legally, the Return can ONLY be implemented to the refugee's original home and land in 1948, not anywhere else, even in Palestine.

Why did they leave ?

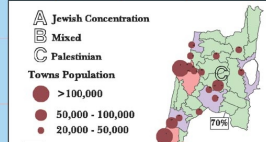

More than half of the refugees were expelled by Jewish forces before Israel was created on Palestinian land...

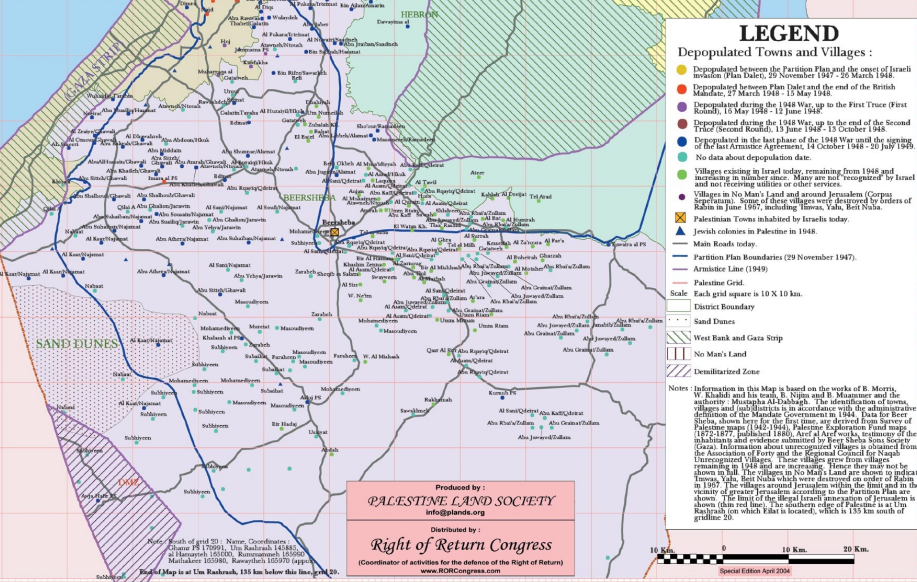

* These are estimates of remaining expelled refugees in Lebanon and Gaza. The best homes available there remain the little regard on the Jews in the cities and that the refugees live in a highly empty.

LEGEND

Depopulated Towns and Villages :

- Yellow circle: Depopulated by the Partition Plan and the onset of Israeli Invasion (May 1948 - 15 November 1947 - 20 March 1948)
- Red circle: Depopulated by UN Plan (June 1947 and the end of the British Mandate, 15 May 1948 - 15 May 1948)
- Blue circle: Depopulated during the 1948 War, up to the First Truce (First Truce, 15 May 1948 - 13 June 1948)
- Orange circle: Depopulated during the 1948 War, up to the end of the Second Truce (Second Truce, 13 June 1948 - 13 October 1948)
- Green circle: Depopulated in the last phase of the 1948 War until the signing of the last Armistice Agreements, 14 October 1948 - 20 July 1949
- Light green circle: No data about depopulation date
- Green square: Villages existing in Israel today, remaining from 1948 and increasing in number since. Many are not "recognised" by Israel and not receiving utilities or other services.
- Blue square: Villages in No Man's Land and around Jerusalem (Corpus Separatum, 1948-1967) and in the West Bank (occupied since 1967) and in Gaza (occupied since 1967). Villages destroyed by Israel in 1948.
- Blue triangle: Palestinian towns inhabited by Israel today.
- Red triangle: Jewish colonies in Palestine in 1948.
- Black line: Main Roads today.
- Blue line: Partition Plan Boundaries (29 November 1947).
- Red line: Armistice Line (1949).
- Green line: Palestine Grid.
- Black line: District Boundary.
- Black line: Sand Dunes.
- Blue line: West Bank and Gaza Strip.
- White area: No Man's Land.
- Black line: Demilitarized Zone.
